Jolly Boys' Outing to Bath
(Aqua Sulis)
20th July 2006

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The City of Bath is a World Heritage City, visited by thousands of people from all over the world, not forgetting the JB's. Since our previous visit there have been only two events worthy of note; one is the opening of a Wetherspoons and the other the controversial Thermae Bath Spa project (see map). It is years behind schedule and costs have escalated from £13 million to £36.2 million and could possibly reach £45 million once interest and legal settlements have been sorted out. Evidently the main problems were the use of the wrong sort of waterproof paint and leaks through the concrete. If it is actually open by the date of this visit and you can make time for a session, the cheapest treatment is a one and a half hour soak in the open-air thermal bath for £12. A full body massage will set you back £45 and a Vichy Shower £48.
