SHERBORNE - BRIEF HISTORY, TOWN CENTRE MAP & PUBS

The Saxons named Sherborne scir burne - the place of the clear stream - and made it the capital of Wessex. In the 12th century Roger de Caen, Bishop of built a fortified palace. Taken by General Fairfax in 1645, the romantic ruins remain and are in the care of English Heritage. It is now known as Sherborne Caeligh, Sherborne is, without doubt, one of the most beautiful towns in England. With its abundance of medieval buildings, superb Abbey, world famous Scatles, Sherborne has much to offer visitors. Sherborne Boys School, originally King Edward's School, has been built on the remains of the abbey buildings great public schools of England and still uses the monastic buildings attached to the Abbey. The town is crammed with historic interest with 17th, 18th and unspoiled streets. Medieval buildings are abound in the town, the most important of which are The Almshouse of St John the Baptist and St John the Evang The Julian, a 16th Cent house originally the hospice of St Julian of Norwich.
