Worcester earned its title Civitas Fidelis (The Faithful City) due to its loyalty to the Royalist cause during the Civil War. This loyalty may have had something to do with a Royalist garrison being stationed in the City. In the Battle of Worcester 1651, Cromwell finally defeated the army of Charles II. The City can claim to be one of the longest inhabited settlements in Britain, with evidence of people living here continuously since the 5th. Century. The City has been an important market town particularly for hops, corn and malt and the making of porcelain still continues at the Royal Worcester Factory that was founded in 1788.
