Jolly Boys trip to Cheltenham 19th February 2009

Cheltenham is famous for its Georgian architecture, GCHQ, and as the birth place of Gustav (von) Holst, the composer of The Planets. Being a Spa Town it is also noted for its Adams Ale but sadly this is not the case for the Real stuff. Good Real ale pubs are few and <u>far</u> between and not conveniently situated near a bus route.

The visit commences with a short bus ride to the centre of town and ends with a <u>fairly long</u> walk back to the Station.

Itinerary

On arriving at Cheltenham, take the Stagecoach D bus (towards Cleeve) from outside the main station entrance and get off in the town centre at Clarence Street (Stop 8). This service runs every 10 minutes and takes about 10 minutes.
