A Bit of Railway History:-

The first station in Maidstone was, what is now, Maidstone West. It was opened in 1844 as the terminus of a branch line from Maidstone Road (now Paddock Wood).

Maidstone West became a through station in 1856 when the line was extended by the SER to Strood. Maidstone East was opened as Maidstone by the London Chatham & Dover Railway in 1874 and Maidstone Barracks was opened on the same date.
