Jolly Boys to Derby Thursday 30th August 2012

Derby is mainly of interest to us as the centre of the Midland Railway which has left a heritage of rail industry (though much reduced nowadays).

The Tour

Derby station is not close to the town centre (where most of the pubs are).

It is just under a mile to walk taking about 30 minutes – the walking route is shown on map 1 in red and the last part is also on map 2. Start by bearing right out of the station, cross the road and go down Victoria Street past the Victoria Inn.

The alternative is to catch a bus to the town centre. The bus stop is outside the Waterfall (bear right and cross road) and it is marked (not surprisingly) "Buses to Town Centre". Only takes a few minutes. Get off around Albert Street (underlined in red on maps) and walk up to the first pub.

The Pubs

All the pubs are in the 2012 GBG. Numbers 1 to 4 are all close to each other in the centre. No 5 is on the way back to the station via a walk along the River Derwent.
