Jollyboys come to Thame November 1st 2012

Thame is a pretty Oxfordshire market town with a wide High Street stretching for a quarter of a mile. Our visit will take in hostelries over the whole of this stretch. Thame used to be on the railway from Princes Risborough to Oxford, but is now served only by a parkway station on the edge of the nearby village of Haddenham. Thence a short 7 minutes bus ride to Thame town hall outside Coop.

For lovers of architecture Thame has a veritable galaxy of interesting buildings from timber frame to Georgian houses and a splendid Early English to Perpendicular period church. Opposite the church is The Prebendal the home until earlier this year of the late Robin Gibb of the Bee Gees.

There have been guite a few other famous residents of Thame down the ages.

Eating

Eating in Thame seems expensive even to me mains £8-9 for basic pub food. The Swan is the best bet as they had a specials board Gammon egg chips etc £6.50

For breakfast eaters

There is no Spoons in Thame. I can give you three options

- 1 Aylesbury new since our visit at bottom of Market Square next to bus station.
- 2 On front of Baker Street station 10 minutes walk to Marylebone
- 3 In High Wycombe where we assembled for the Chiltern trip. This is a 10 minute walk from station. Plenty of trains to Wycombe

If you prefer to go early to Thame and are feeling flush then the Swan is open from 9:00 for breakfast at £6.50

The Thatch does sandwiches and coffee etc

Travel

If anyone is intending to use Aylesbury Spoons let me know and I will collect you in time for bus otherwise I shall join at Princes Risborough on the 9:40 from Marylebone. There is a direct bus at 20 minute intervals the 280 from Aylesbury to Thame 24 mins to the Parkway station then 9 minutes to Thame and on to Oxford a further 55 minutes away.

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Bus no 280 to Thame and Oxford stand 11 at Aylesbury (1 minute from Spoons) to Thame Town Hall via Thame and Haddenham Parkway. If you are feeling particularly lazy stay on bus to the next stop after the Town Hall.

The stop at Haddenham station is in front of the booking office on the down side; beware it is used by buses in both directions you need the Oxford bus.
