Jolly Boys Visit to Bristol 24th April, 2014.

This trip will follow a similar pattern as previously but will include some pubs we have not tried before but to make a sensible route will also include a couple of old favourites. We will be trying one of the newish outlets in Kings Street which, with a total of six Pubs/Restaurants, is apparently becoming known as THE place for beer in Bristol. To add a bit of culture, on the way to The Beer Emporium we will pass the Llandoger Trow, a Brewers Fayre pub restaurant. Dating from about 1664, it is reputed to be where Daniel Defoe met Alexander Selkirk, a Scottish sailor who had been shipwrecked on a Pacific island, and on whose experience Defoe based 'Robinson Crusoe'.

Back to the Pubs. For early-birds there are two Wetherspoons. To get to the first, after coming through the station barriers in the booking hall keep to your right and follow the signs for the Ferry/City Centre/Cycle Path. Cross the road and the Knights Templar is just around the corner from Starbucks.

The second Wetherspoons is near No.1 Pub on the itinerary and to walk to the Commercial Rooms (43-45 Corn Street) takes 15 to 20 minutes. An alternative is the No. 8 or 9 bus from the top of approach road. They run every 6 minutes with a journey time of about 15 mins. Get off at the city centre stop opposite the Hippodrome Theatre, cross over the road to Claire Street or St Stephens Street Avenue and continue to Corn Street.
