

Hastings Old Town Thursday 23rd January 2014

Culture :-

Hastings is not just famous for ASBOs, wine'os and East European refugees; it has two cliff railways (the East Cliff lift is the steepest in Britain at 1 in 1.128), a miniature railway, a pier (closed due to its condition on our last visit, subsequently burned down), a castle (well ruined), some caves and a "Decimus Burton" area to rival Bath or Tunbridge Wells. It also is home to the biggest shore based fishing fleet in Europe.
