South Shields being at the mouth of the river Tyne was strategically important to the Romans who built a fort to protect their supply lines to Hadrian's Wall. In more recent times export of locally mined coal and shipbuilding maintained that importance-sadly all gone now. The railway came very early to South Shields on account of this coal trade. The first line opened in 1834-The Stanhope and Tyne Railway which brought coal down from Weardale. All that remains now of the extensive rail network of this area, are the Tyne and Wear Metro Line over which we will travel, the coast route from Newcastle via Sunderland, the Port of Tyne Freight Terminal branch from Boldon and the Jarrow oil terminal branch. The town is something of a resort on it's seaward side, with long sandy beaches.

Catherine Cookson, Eric Idle, Sir Frank Williams (F1 fame), Dame Flora Robson, to name some, all came from here.

Wouldhave, Wetherspoons, 16 Mile End Road.NE33 1TA Named after William Wouldhave the inventor of the lifeboat. Leave the metro station via the north end of the platform and you can see the pub accross the road. Until 10.55 2. Address No. 5 formerly the Tram Inn, 5 Market Place NE33 1BH. ## Travel

Tyne and Wear Metro services run every 12 minutes (xx00, xx12, xx24, xx36, xx48 etc) from Central Station to South Shields, and return at xx07, xx19, xx31, xx43 and xx55. The journey is about 25 minutes.

See terms of travel below :-

• Tyne & Wear Metro (Safeguarded Active & Retired Staff only o Free travel is granted and privilege tickets are issued only to staff who entered employment prior to 11 August 1980. If you cease to be eligible for Tyne & Wear Metro facilities on leaving the service, you cannot have these reinstated if you re-enter employment with an Eligible Employer unless there is no gap between leaving the first Eligible Employer and joining the second. o To obtain free travel, use your appropriately dated Staff Travel Card. Only SINGLE privilege tickets are available and to obtain these, you should press the CHILD fare button on ticket issuing machines. o When travelling you should carry you Staff Travel Card (or Status Pass if held) to support the ticket. o On Tyne & Wear Metro's Heworth to Sunderland service the same ticketing arrangements apply. However, exceptionally, they apply also to Active or

Retired safeguarded staff who entered employment on or after 11 August 1980. So a dated Staff Travel Card seems to cover most of us.
