

Jolly Boys visit to Sheffield - 22nd. January 2015

A return visit to Sheffield which has been a popular venue for Jolly Boys outings for many years. I have tried to pick some new pubs this year, which may upset some people who all seem to have their favourites. Still never mind we know we have plenty of venues to fall back on in the event of a major disaster

Note the Google map is useless but should get you there.

Note bus passes are valid on Sheffield Trams

All pubs other than Wetherspoons are listed in GBG 2013 pages 543, 544 - 545.

The Pubs

1. The Benjamin Huntsman, 12 - 18, Cambridge Street, S1 4HP. 0700 - 2400. 0114 263 9500. Wetherspoons. Opposite John Lewis. Named after the inventor of crucible steel. Tram City Hall few minutes walk go left from tram and take the first on the right (about 10 yards from tram) then straight down. Until 1100. Catch the bus. Bus stops go down Cambridge St. to Henry's turn right go left under the underpass come to a rank of bus stops the very last one number 25, although any bus going to the White Lion will do.
2. Sheaf View, 25, Gleadless Road, Heeley, S2 3AA. 1130 - 2330. 0114 249 6455. A genuine free house since 2000 following major refurbishment. The Sheaf has won numerous awards. 6 changing guest beers with a good selection of draught and bottled continental beers. Situated bus stop after the railway bridge walk back under the bridge and turn right should be able to see the pub from the main road. Leave 1215.
3. Broadfield, 452 Abbeydale Road, Nether Edge, S7 1FR. 1200 - 2400, 0114 255 0200. www.broadfield.co.uk. The pub was built on Abbeydale's Broad Fields in 1896 by dairy farmer Albert Twigg, who became its first landlord. The Forum Café Bar Group took over in 2011 and changed the style and atmosphere to create a more authentic Yorkshire pub. An extensive menu with hand made pies and sausages a feature. 5 guest beers. 10 to 15 minute walk from Sheaf View.
4. Cremorne, London Road, Highfield, S2 4LH. A long walk from Broadfield but catch any bus from outside Broadfield and alight at John St. Cremorne is on the other side of the road and back the way we have just come. Beer range varies.
5. Rutland Arms, 86, Brown Street, S1 2BS. 1200 - 2400. 0114 272 9003. www.rutlandarmspeople.co.uk. In the Cultural Industries quarter and near the station. Reopened as a free house in 2009. Blue Bee, Guest beers. (Optional extra we didn't have enough time because of train times)
6. Sheffield Tap, Platform 1B, Sheffield Station, Sheaf St., S1 2BP. 1100 - 2300. 0114 273 7558. www.sheffieldtap.com. Opened in 2005 this was originally the first class refreshment room. Built in 1904. Usually 2 beers from the on site Tapped Brewery opened in 2013.
