Jolly Boys Trip to Brighton 31st March 2016

Today's trip will concentrate on the beer rather than the culture as most of your day will be spent around the less salubrious end of town except, that is, for a brief walk through a small part of the North Laines (Sydney Street).

First a word of warning Brighton being a seaside tourist town expect prices for food and drink, other than fish and chips or jellied eels to be somewhat higher than up north also the majority of pubs remain closed until the midday hour. Nevertheless we will proceed on a route which takes in new, past haunts and old favourites, with food ranging from café British breakfasts to varying cost pub grub including a wide selection of Spanish Tapas which can be shared by however many are on your table.

As our route will keep us well away from all three Brighton Jdw's I will leave you to your own devices when it comes to breakfast. I would however say that there is a good café 50 yards to the right when exiting the main station entrance. Alternatively there are numerous food outlets in Trafalgar Street 100 yards from the station.

Suggested arrival time at Brighton if noshing 10-15 if just drinking 11-10. As there are plenty of routes from London. Coastway's West, Coastway's East, cross country via Gatwick or in Ralph's case leg it and bus I will leave you to determine your own route and timings. The same for going back

Our first port of call is the only establishment to open before 12-00 in this area. Don't be too shocked by the price of your first pint it ain't all like this.

- (1) The Cyclist Brighton Concourse 30 yards from the exit barriers
(NOT RECOMMENDED FOR FOOD) If you can't find this one I am going to

take your Scouts Explorers badge away.

Times - Open from 08-00 but beer served from 11-00. Here supping till 11-50 so don't turn up to early. 10-12 minute walk down hill to:

(2) North Laine Brewhouse Gloucester Street
12-00 to 12-40.

(Food but Pricey. This pub serves one beer duty and tax free, differs weekly)

(3) The Basketmakers Arms 12 Gloucester Road
12-45 -13-20.

(Usual pub grub at better prices) Lunch stop if required.

(3A) For those of you who want an unusual bottled beer for the homeward journey pop into the Trafalgar Off Licence. You pass it on your way to No 4

(4) Prince Albert 48 Trafalgar Street (You passed it on the way to No2)
13-25 to 14-00.

(Food available. Good cheap burgers and a wide selection of Tapas

(5) Evening Star 55-56 Surrey Street
(14-10 to end)

About the Pub

The former Lost Property Office on the main concourse at Brighton railway station has been converted into a bar with restaurant area. It is run by the people who previously founded Geronimo Inns. It opened at the end of June 2014. Bareboarded with an eclectic range of tables and chairs. The bar counter is wooden topped but infilled below with old suitcases in every shape, size and colour from one of the co-owners' collection. As befits a railway refreshment room teas and coffees are sold but the main emphasis is on cask and keg beers and bottles. There are 3 handpumps selling local ales. There are bar snacks and full restaurant meals available all day. Alcohol is sold from 1100; the pub may close early if trade is slack.
