Jolly Boys Outing: Thursday 17th. August 2017 Camden Town & Kentish Town – London NW1 & NW5

Travel information - getting there, around and back

The modes of travel include legs/buses/trains/tubes ie London Underground – Northern Line, London Overground – NLL, also National Rail – Thameslink. Numerous bus routes criss-cross the area.

London Overground – North London Line – Free pass boundaries. Both directions of travel Stratford – Dalston Kingsland- Eastern Anglia Dalston Kingsland – South Acton – LM South Acton – Richmond – Southern Dalston Kingsland – Kensington Olympia – LM Kensington Olympia – Clapham Junction – Southern

Pub 1 is approx. 350 yards from Camden Town LU Northern line which is the nearest station. Camden Road – over ground NLL is approx 800 yards (or 550 yards via towpath if the repairs have finished)

Camden Road - over ground NLL is accessible by train from the east (6 per hour) from Stratford (6.25 miles 22 minutes) or from the south at 4 per hour from Clapham Junction (10 miles 35 minutes) or Richmond 4 per hour (11.25 miles 36 minutes)

Return from pub 5 350 yards to Kentish Town LU Northern line or National Rail Thameslink to St Pancras International and the south at 24 and 54 minutes past the hour.

Recce 1 on 4 July 2017: Pub 1 has the cheapest ales, pub 2 has some ales below £4 per pint, pubs 3, 4 and 5 all ales £4+ per pint.

Culture

The desire to live in a once neglected portion of the Saucer or better still on one of the rims has produced some odd migrations, especially of the professional classes and the followers of the arts. The high cost of central housing makes for dispersion. Camden Town was little thought of not long ago: it was a low price, low life area through which the bus traversed en route to Hampstead. Camden Town was also the home of the famous murderer Dr Crippen.

Now the sad Victorian streets have had their gloom dispelled by occupiers with stage, radio, television and gossip column reputations. (Note Grafton Studios RH side of Angler Street en route between pubs 3 and 4).

Mouldering facades have been brightened by new paint and colourful doorways. The same thing has happened on the slopes of Islington.
