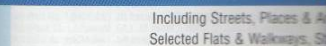


Jolly Boys Outing - Lancaster - 8th. June 2017

Pubs

1. Sir Richard Owen, 4, Spring Garden St., LA1 1RQ. 01524541500. Wetherspoons. Exit 1100 go left up to next road (Penny Street) and go left to :-
2. Brown Cow, 4 Penny Street, Lancaster, LA1 1XF. [\(01524\) 66474](tel:0152466474). 1100 - 2400. 3 Regular beers - Thwaites. Food 11.05-11.40. Right out of the pub and down Penny St. to no.3.
3. Apothecary (formerly Lanky's Lounge), 52 Penny Street, Lancaster, LA1 1XX. Opens 11.30. (Though it was open at 11.10 on the recce.)[\(01524\) 555999](tel:01524555999). A 1960s building recently run as a dimly-lit cocktail bar with all-night opening. Acquired Nov 2016 by a licensee from another pub in town who has attempted to import the ethos of his old pub - notably real ale, daily music and free food. It will be interesting to watch how this hybrid evolves. 2 changing beers more promised. Turn right out of pub and go down Penny Street. 11.42-12.20
4. Sun, 63 Church Street, Lancaster, LA1 1ET. 1100 - 2400 [\(01524\) 66006](tel:0152466006), thesunhotelandbar.co.uk. 5 Changing beers - Lancaster, Thwaites. Completely altered in 2004 and then extended next door in early 2005. 12.35-13.15-Food. Back down to and left into Bridge Lane then via cobbled passage just at the corner to :-
5. Three Mariners, (formerly Carpenter's Arms), Bridge Lane, Lancaster, LA1 1EE Commonly claimed to be the oldest pub in Lancaster. It certainly looks old, inside as well as out and many of the beams and stones are old. Built into the side of Castle Hill, the cellar is excavated at first-floor level. The strip of cobbles at the front and the nearby grassy areas are occupied by tables for drinkers. The pub is now a popular watering hole with a thriving local clientele, and is involved with the maritime section of the Lancaster Music Festival in October. 13.20-13.50.
6. Merchant's (also known as 1688 Merchants; Merchants 1688), 29 Castle Hill, Lancaster, LA1 1YN. 1130. Converted wine-merchants cellars built in 1688 and an extensive outdoor drinking area create a peaceful haven from the hubbub of the city centre. The main drinking areas are in three separate 'tunnels' with a fourth forming the entrance and bar area. Quiz night on Sundays. Look out for the stoneware bottles used in the construction of the cellar walls. House beer "Castle Blonde" brewed by Old School. Many board games available. Live music every Saturday eve. Serves 7 changing beers. 14.00Till End.



- Each street name is followed by the Postcode District, then by its **Locality**, e.g. **Ableyford** RD, LA1: Land... 1A 30 is in the LA1 Postcode District. The page number is shown in bold type.
- A strict alphabetical order is followed in which Aa, Rd, St, etc. all count as one letter, e.g. **Ash Tree Gr.** appears after **Ashdon Wlk.** but before **Aldersome Way**.
- Streets and a selection of flats and walkways that cannot be shown are in the connected shown in brackets, e.g. **Ableyford** Ho. LA1: Land... 1A 30
- Addresses that are in more than one part are referred to as not continuous.
- Places and areas are shown in the index in **BLUE TYPE** and the map labels and not to the place name shown on the map, e.g. **SOUTHERN CROSS**
- An example of a selected place of interest is **Canterbury Heritage Cntr.**
- An example of a station is **Bare Lane Station (Rail)** ... 20 14
- An example of a Hospital or selected Healthcare Facility is **QUEEN VICTORIA**
- Map references for entries that appear on large scale maps **34** are shown, e.g. **Ashburn Pl.** LA1: Land... 55 34 (SH 22)

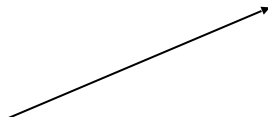
