1. **Black Buoy, Black Buoy Hill. 01206-822425 hrs 11-11 Best rural pub (Camra) 3rd year running. 6 quest ales on constant rotation, Colchester's first community pub. Food 12-3.**



2. **Rose & Crown, The Quay, tel 01206-826371 hrs 11-11 This is now a Greene King pub but do 4 quest ales. 10% discount for Camra members.**

3. **The Station, 27 station rd. tel 01206-822991 hrs 2-11 this pub does not open till 2.00 but have asked if he will open a little earlier and has**



agreed No food.

4. The Horse & Groom, (OPTIONAL) this pub is in Good Beer Guide, is an Adnams pub with 3 ales on with a Guest. Opens at 10.30. For those who want to venture up to this pub, you can catch the 61 or 62 from opposite the co-op, it is a 2min ride or ten min walk. To come back to the station, get the 61 only from opposite the Horse & Groom.
