

Jolly Boys Outings – Liverpool 27th. October 2022
(Recce 11th. August 2022)

1. Start at Wetherspoons on Lime St. Station until 10.45.
Left out of Lime St. Station. Walk down Lime St. and Renshaw St. Turn left into Hardman Street, and left into Hope St., past the famous Philharmonic pub (not open). Along on the right is the Pen Factory. For those wishing to save their legs somewhat. Go down to the Merseyrail station underneath Lime St Station. All the trains circulate the central area (Lime St., Central, James St. Moorfields clockwise, so any train will take you to Liverpool Central. Out of the station, turn left up Bold St. to the big road junction at the top go left and right into Hardman St. and follow the directions as above,
2. Pen Factory, 13, Hope St., L1 9BQ. 0151 709 7887. pen-factory.co.uk. Wood burning stove and small Garden. At least 5 handpumps with beers from smaller breweries. Food. Opens 1100. Leave 11.35
On leaving here turn right and walk towards “Paddy’s Wigwam”, standing large at the end of Hope St. Left at the end into Mount Pleasant. Walk down to Roscoe St., and turn left the Roscoe Head is at the other end on the right.
3. Roscoe Head, 24, Roscoe St., L1 2SX. 0151 709 4365. roscoehead.co.uk. One of the famous five pubs that has featured in every edition of the Good Beer Guide. 6 handpumps. 1130. Leave 12.00. Just round the corner and up Hardman St. (again) on the left is the Fly in the Loaf’
4. Fly in the Loaf, 13, Hardman St., L1 9AS. 0151 708 0817. Owned by Okells Brewery. Serves a changing range of beers beside Okells. 1200. Leave 12.30.
Return down Hardman St. to the road junction. Cross Renshaw St and turn first right into Bond St.. Walk down to the bottom. Turn left into Hanover St.. On the right is the Head of Steam
5. Head of Steam, 85-89, Hanover St., L1 3DZ. 0151 708 6096. Plenty of seating, handy for Liverpool 1 shops. 1200. Food menu. Leave 13.15.
Return to Bond St and enter Central Station. Trains are every few minutes. You will need either a train to Ormskirk, (platform 2) Kirby (platform 1) or Southport. (platform 2) It takes 3 minutes from Central to Moorfields. Anything else from Central will be a circle service returning to the Wirral via James St and Birkenhead.
Turn right out of Moorfields Station cross the road and on the corner of Tithebarn St. is the Lion
6. Lion Tavern, 67, Moorfields, L2 2BP. theliontavernliverpool.co.uk. Named after the locomotive. Grade II listed. Mosaic floors, tiled corridor and stained glass. 1200. (Moorfields Station). Leave 13.50.
Return past Moorfields Station and turn right into Dale St. turn left and along on the left is the Ship and Mitre. If you have already had your fill catch the train from Moorfields back to Lime St. Station from platform 3 (avoid trains to Ormskirk, Kirby or Southport, which don’t go via Lime St.)
7. Ship and Mitre, 133, Dale St., L2 2JH (by Queensway Tunnel) 0151 236 0859, theshipandmitre.com. The Pub is partly hidden by the Queensway Tunnel entrance. 15 handpumps. Has its own flagship beers brewed by Stamps Brewery in Crosby. 1100.
Return to the station via St John’s Lane. 8 minute walk.
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
