

JBs Newport 20th February 2025

Since our last visit the Tiny Rebel has closed, so this visit's itinerary has some changes from 2023, but starts and finishes at the same venues.

The Pubs

1. **The John Wallace Linton**, Cambrian Road. Usual Wetherspoons gathering/breakfast location. Leave at 11:15, turn left and follow the footpath round to the right into High Street for:
2. **The Carpenters**. Opens at 11:00. Felin Foel beers. Leave at 12:00, turning left and a short journey along High Street brings us to:
3. **Ye Olde Murrenger House**. Opens at 12:00. Sam Smith's pub and one of the candidates for the 'Oldest Pub in Newport' title. Food available. Leave at 12:30, turning right and continuing down High Street and taking the first right into Bridge Street to:
4. **The Lamb**. The other contender for 'Oldest Pub in Newport'. Google Maps suggests that it opens at 09:00, but 11:00 – 12:00 is closer to reality. 2 St Austell Breweries pumps plus 2 more for occasional guest beers. Leave at 13:15, turning right back to Westgate Square and then right again into Stow Hill for:
5. **The Pen and Wig**. Probably the best place for food, so this is the suggested food stop. Changing range of primarily Wales based breweries' products on offer. Until finish.

The easiest route back to the station is via the exit to the beer garden (mind the fairly steep steps) and car park, turn right and go down the hill back to Bridge Street then turn left. Just beyond the Travelodge turn right up a step through the car park and the station will be seen over the pedestrian crossing directly ahead.

Trains to Newport are operated by Great Western, CrossCountry and Transport for Wales.
